Psalm 22:29-31

My Brief Time at Trinity

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I want to write just a few words: privilege; absence; return. (Another kind of trinity!) And then expand upon these words.

PRIVILEGE.

I've been retired from active ministry for 10 years. Typical of the retired pastor I've done the interim (filling in between pastors under call), also volunteered in the community, even worked part-time for the NC Synod for 5 years. All of which were fulfilling. What I've most wanted to do in retirement is to enable pastors to get a break from the rigors of their callings. So, when the Synod leadership made these mini-sabbaticals available, I raised my hand. This is a dream come true for me. I've longed for the opportunity to support pastoral colleagues who otherwise may not receive extended time away. I'm so glad Pastor Alice is taking this break. I consider it a great privilege to briefly receive the baton from her, so she can walk (run, in her case) into rest. Frankly, I owe it to the church to assist pastors in this way. Thank you!!

ABSENCE.

Your pastor will be away. Miss her. Miss her dearly. And let her be absent. My prayer is that Pastor Alice sets aside her great passion to serve as your pastor, for a while. And that in so doing, she will gain new perspective. Maybe, she'll get in touch with some 'un-lived' portion of her life, she otherwise, would not have encountered.

I asked your council leaders what their hopes were for Trinity while Pastor Alice was away. To a person they said, "For Pastor Alice to know that we can step up, and the ministry can continue without her, for a time." That's my hope too.

RETURN.

When someone so central to a community is away, something may also 'bubble up' for you as you take note of Pastor Alice's absence. What may come to the surface, may surprise you. And it may be something you are most thankful about Pastor Alice's ministry. Please take note. Capture those thoughts, those soulful ideas. Then, pass them to Pastor Alice upon her return.

It will be a gift for your pastor.

Just A Few Words As I write this, I'm counting down days until my mini-Sabbatical begins. I am really excited for the opportunity I'll have to learn and grow and be restored. I am also excited for the opportunity for Trinity to learn and grow and be restored.

To remind everybody, the start date of my mini-sabbatical is Monday, April 1, 2024; end date is Monday, May 13, 2024. You will be in good hands and well cared for by Rev. David Sloop, a retired ELCA pastor. Pastor Sloop will lead Sunday worship and be in the office one day most weeks. Pastor Sloop will be gone two of the six Sundays (he and his wife, Sally, already had plans before being invited to serve as interim); on those Sundays, Rev. Marcia Kifer will serve as supply pastor.

Because of a generous grant awarded by the Peeler Grant of the North Carolina Synod, there is no cost to the congregation. This grant fully covers all expenses for Pastor Sloop and Pastor Kifer. I am also excited to share

with you that I have been awarded a grant through the Casey Grant which will provide funding for almost half my mini-Sabbatical expenses. I am very humbled to receive this support and encouragement.

Pastor Sloop will be available for pastoral care emergencies. If there is a need, please contact Aaron Webb, congregation president, or Anica Weeks, administrative assistant, and they will contact Pastor Sloop. Please understand, I will not be available since I'll be travelling or on-site studying. Pastor Sloop will contact me if he feels it is necessary.

Here's my itinerary:

- Drive to Austin, TX; spend several days at Community First! Village;
drive back to Rocky Mount, NC.
- Drive to Blacksburg, VA; hike part of the Appalachian Trail called Kelly Knob;
drive back to Rocky Mount, NC.
- Drive to Great Barrington, MA; spent several days at Gutherie Center;
drive back to Rocky Mount, NC.
- Back to Trinity on Tuesday, May 14, 2024.

This is a gracious time for all of us. I'll miss you while I'm gone, but look forward to returning with a renewed spirit and energy for our ministry together.

You all continue in my prayers. I ask that I would be included in yours.
